

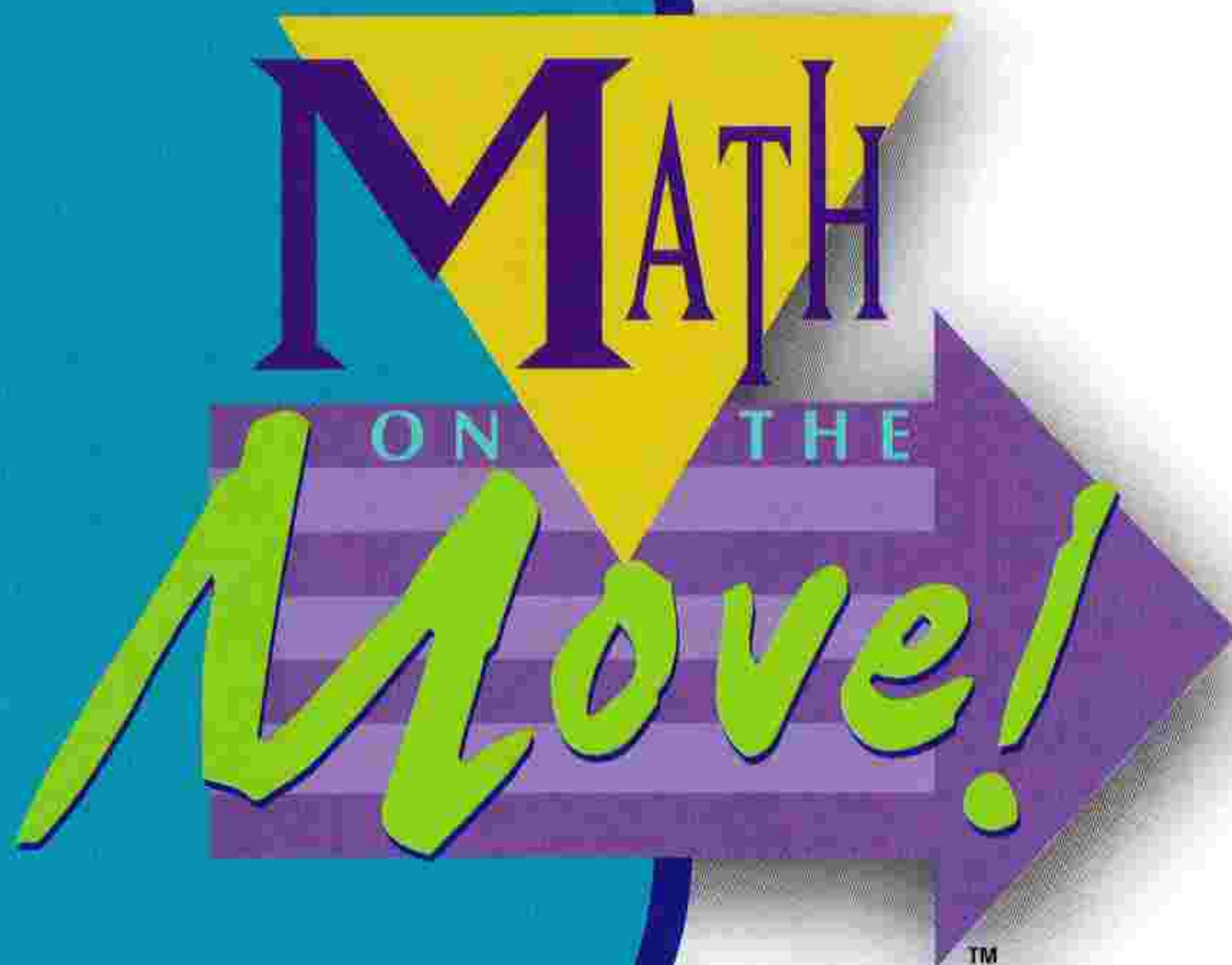

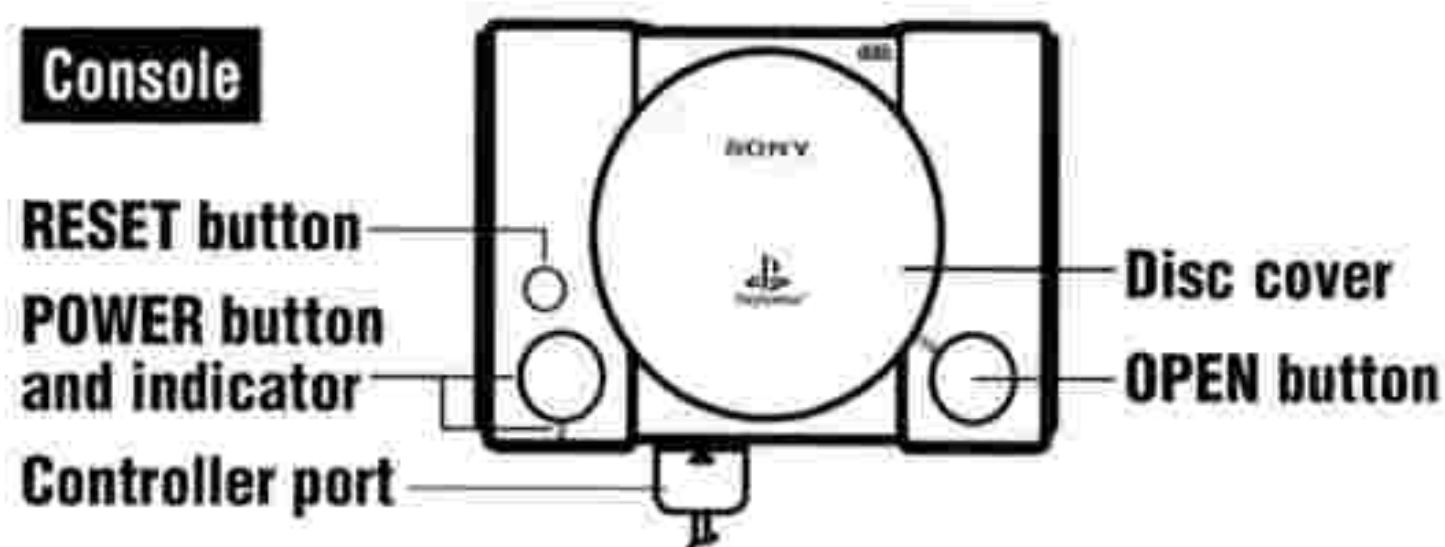
This adventure uses video, music, and animation that will motivate your child to practice and learn mathematics strategies for multiplication and division.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

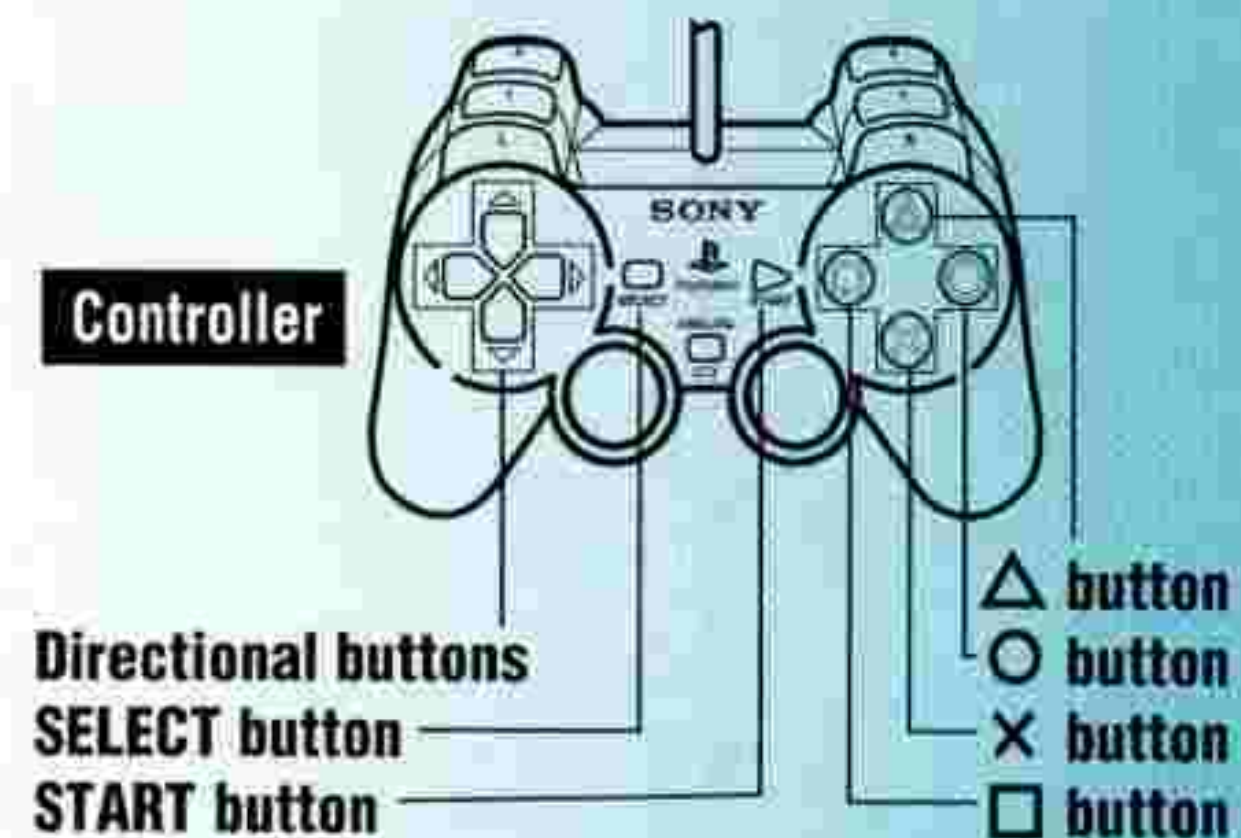
- Multiply a number by 2
- Divide a number by breaking it up
- Use mental mathematics to solve multiplication and division problems

Getting Started

Console



Controller



Set up your PlayStation® game console according to the instructions in its Instruction Manual. Make sure the power is off before inserting or removing a disc. Insert the disc and close the disc door. Insert the game controller(s) and turn on the PlayStation game console. Follow the on-screen instructions to start the adventure.

- Use the **arrows** on the game controller to move the pointer.
- Use the **X button** on the game controller for clicking.
- See a funny video by clicking the **musical notes** in the upper-right corner of the screen.
- Choose the mathematics subject your child wants to explore—"Doubles and Doubling" or "Breaking Up the Dividend." There are two options for each subject—a video lesson and a corresponding practice section.

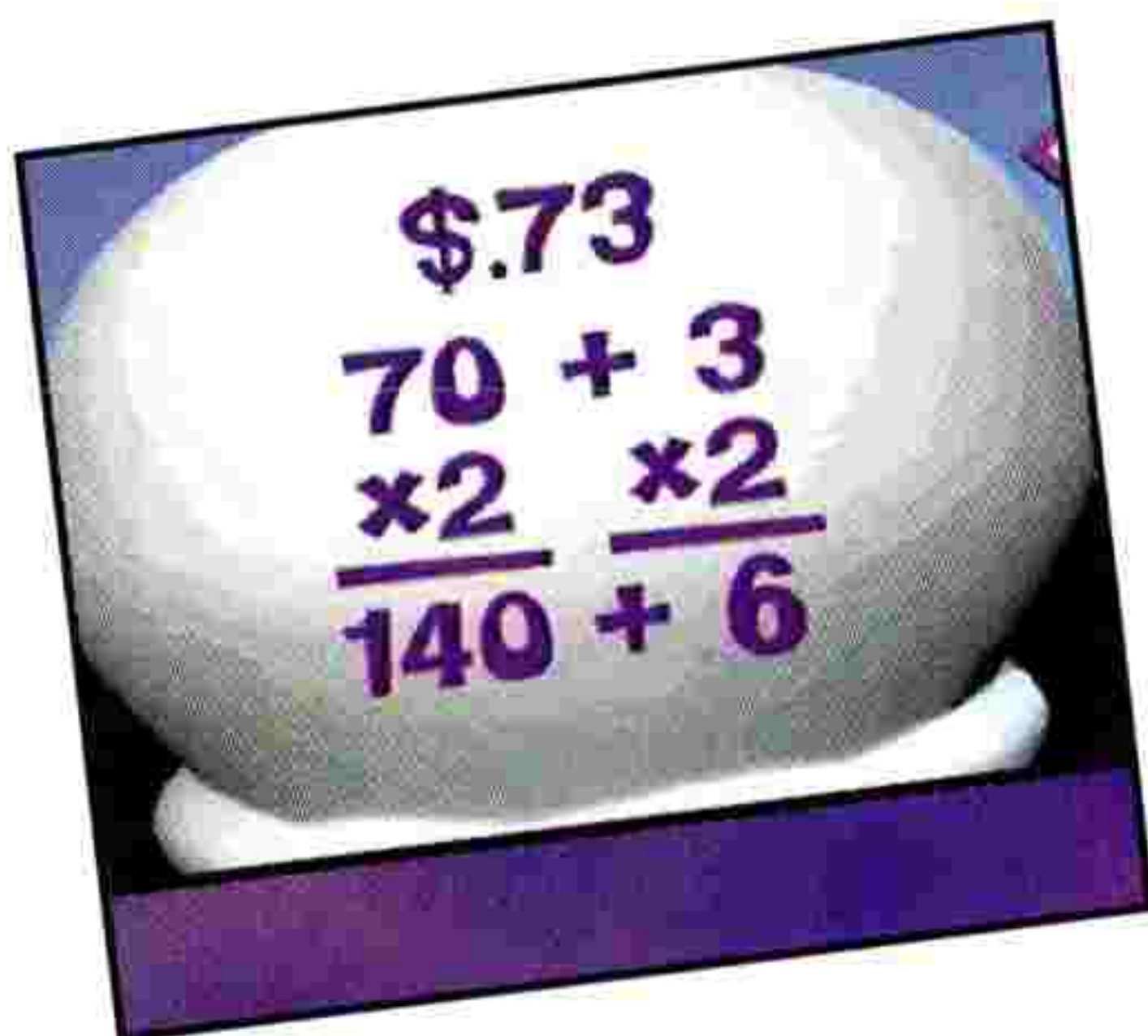


- Click **Lesson** to learn about the chosen subject.
- Click **Practice** after your child has viewed a lesson.
- When viewing a lesson or practicing, click the screen to display the video controls. Use the **forward** arrows to skip ahead or use the **rewind** arrows to go back. If your child wants more time to think about a problem, click **pause**. Then, click the **play arrow** to continue.
- Click the **square** in the center of the video controls to stop the game and return to the opening screen.
- Click outside the video control bar to hide it.

“Doubles and Doubling”

Multiplication is fun when your child can double a number by doubling the parts and adding. Have your child:

- click “Doubles and Doubling” **Lesson**
- click “Doubles and Doubling” **Practice** after he or she understands the strategy



Have your child double the miles it takes to go one way to figure out the total distance for a round trip. For example, if a one-way trip to the zoo is 43 miles, then the round-trip miles to and from the zoo will be 40×2 plus 3×2

$$40 \times 2 = 80$$

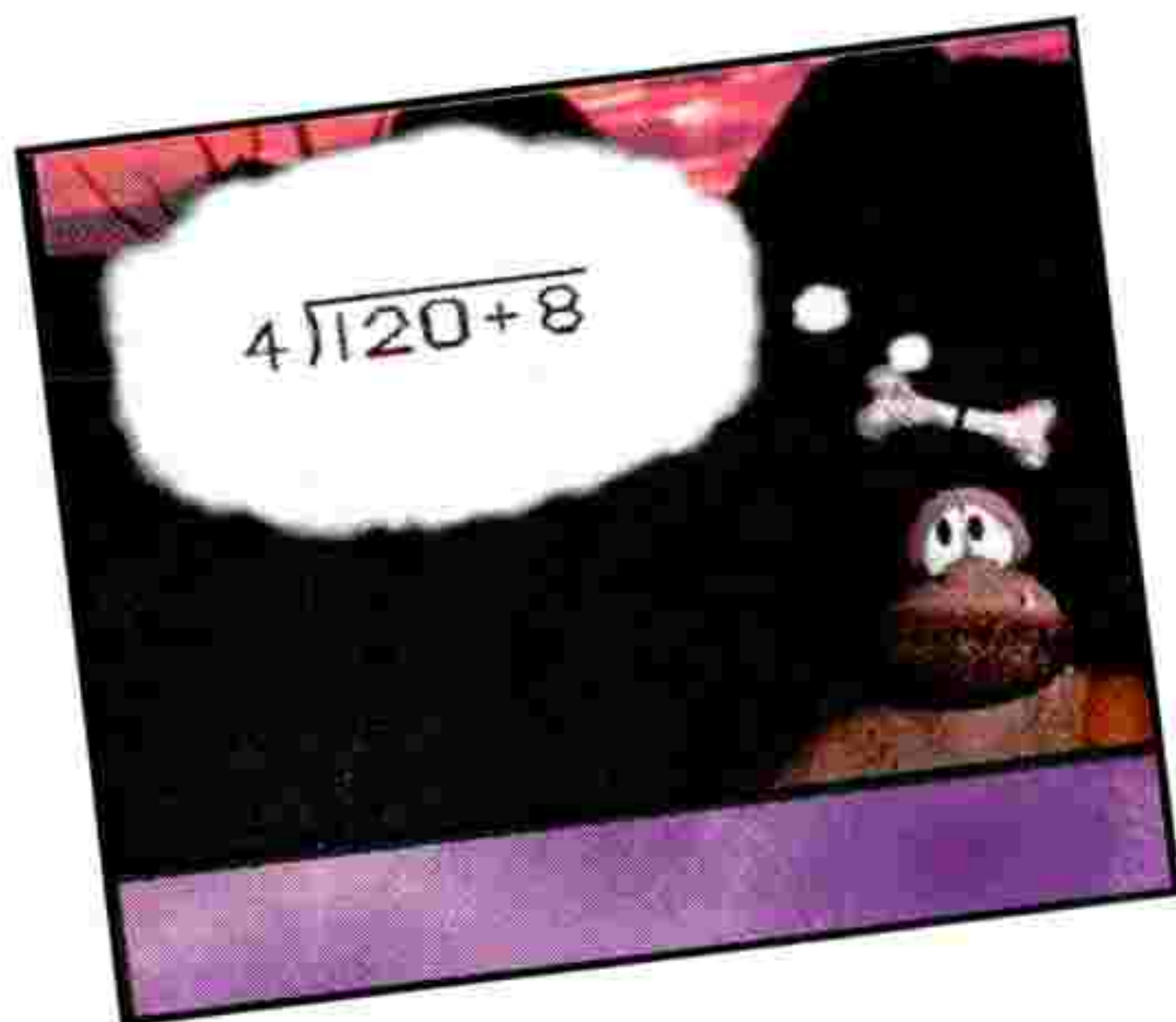
$$3 \times 2 = 6$$

$$80 + 6 = 86 \text{ miles round trip}$$

“Breaking Up the Dividend”

Mastering the “Breaking Up the Dividend” strategy helps with division. Your child will learn to expand the dividend and divide its parts by the divisor. Have your child:

- click “Breaking Up the Dividend” **Lesson**
- click “Breaking Up the Dividend” **Practice** after he or she understands the strategy



Have your child practice breaking up numbers by identifying all the factors of a number. Make a list of those factors. Is one of the factors the divisor? For example, one set of factors for 84 is 4×21 , or $(2 \times 2) \times (3 \times 7)$ because $2 \times 2 = 4$ and $3 \times 7 = 21$.

Extending the Learning Experience

Family Activities

Expanding the Story

Have your child write a multiplication story following these rules: End the story with a question and answer the question by multiplying. For example, Tom and Sam each had 5 cats. They visited Tina and Susie who each had 10 fish. They made a chart for their school report to show the total number of pets the 4 friends had. What was the number?

Place-Setting Multiplication

Ask your child to set the dining table before dinner. If each place setting needs 3 utensils, have your child multiply the number of place settings by 3 to determine the total number of utensils he or she will need.

Multiplication Walk

Take a "Multiplication Walk" around your neighborhood. Every step your child takes measures about 2 feet. To measure the width of the road, count the number of steps it takes your child to cross it and multiply by 2. What is the length of a parked car? Make a chart recording the distances and arrange them from shortest to longest. For added difficulty, repeat the walk using your steps. Every 2 steps you take measures about 5 feet. Compare and discuss with your child the results of the 2 walks.
